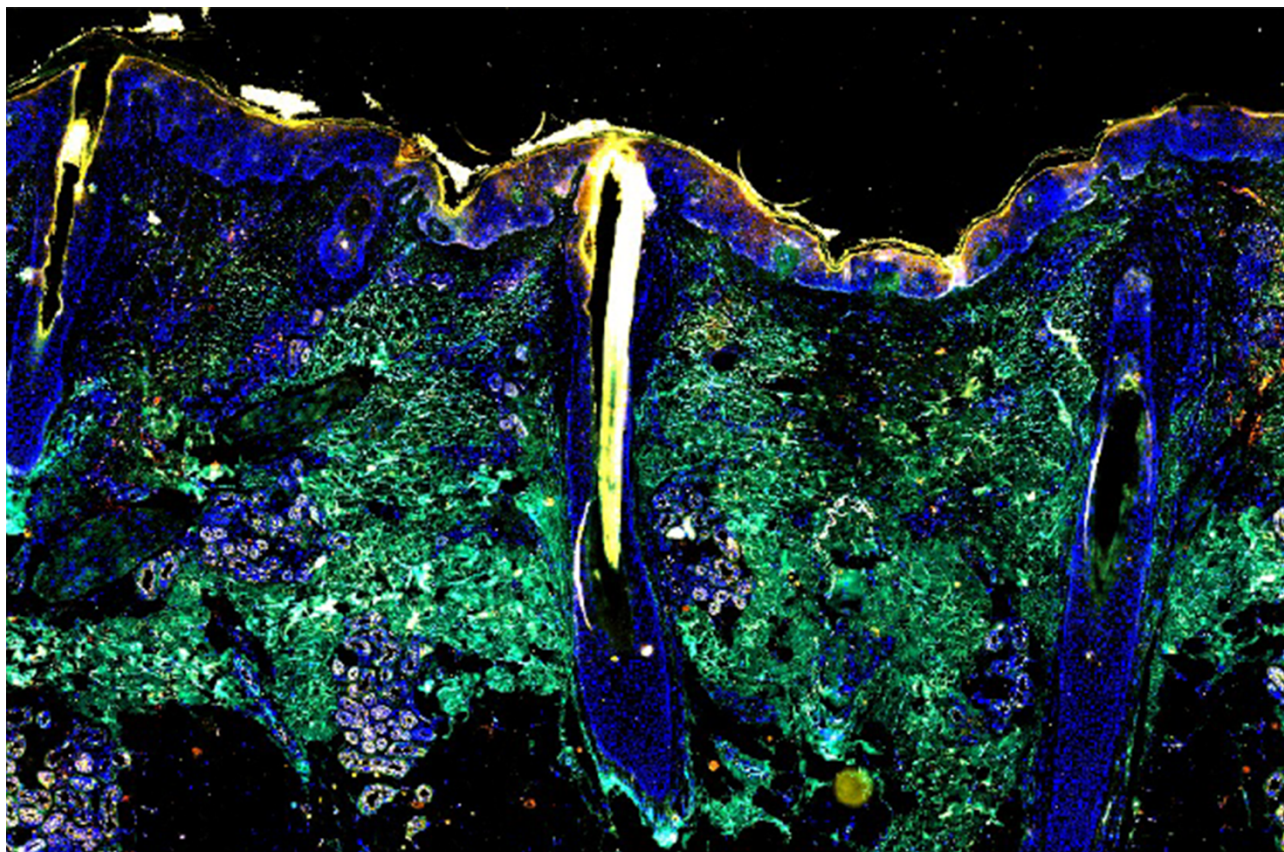

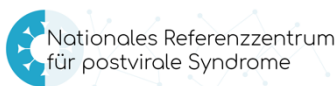

It is our great pleasure to welcome you to the Annual Meeting 2026 of the Austrian Society for Allergology and Immunology.

As you can see on the following pages, we have an exciting line-up of speakers and sessions. We will open with a session chaired by the ÖGAI Metabolism working group, will then learn about the latest insights into post-acute infection syndromes, spotlight novel approaches for the design of CAR T cells and hear about how the microbiome impacts the gut-brain axis. The meeting will close on Friday afternoon with the Ruth Sonntag Nussenzweig Award session and the EFIS-EJI Ita Askonas prize session. These distinguished awards celebrate the outstanding achievements of women in science, raising their visibility and contributing to a more equitable, inclusive, and diverse scientific community. Further details on both prizes are provided in subsequent sections of the program.

We also thank all sponsors for their generous support. With their contributions, we provide a dynamic meeting platform to share exciting new research data, discuss their translational and clinical applications and explore their broader scientific implications. We further promote networking among scientists, clinicians and exhibitors.

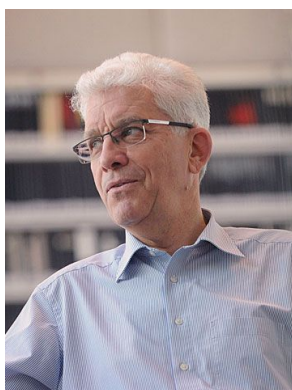

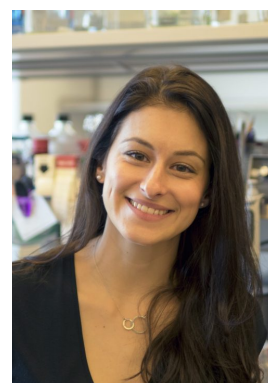

8. About the Ruth Sonntag Nussenzweig Award

The Ruth Sonntag Nussenzweig Award constitutes a targeted positive action measure aimed at addressing the persistent underrepresentation of women and non-binary scientists in senior and independent leadership positions in immunology. The prize honors rising female or non-binary immunologists with a maximum of 15 years scientific experience after their PhD, who have demonstrated outstanding promise and innovation in their own independent research. Named in tribute to Prof. Ruth Sonntag Nussenzweig, a pioneering leader in immunology of malaria, the award celebrates her groundbreaking contributions and dedication to advancing global health. By recognizing and supporting emerging female scientists, the prize aims to foster greater gender equity in science and encourages more women to excel in immunology and related fields. The prize will be given every 2 years at the Annual ÖGAI Meeting or at a special ÖGAI Symposium.



Ruth Sonntag Nussenzweig Award 2026

Honoring mid-career rising female or non-binary immunologists in Austria

Named in tribute to **Prof. Ruth Sonntag Nussenzweig**, a pioneering leader in immunology and malaria research, this award aims to honor emerging female or non-binary immunologists with exceptional scientific achievements.

Target group / career stage

Mid-career **female or non-binary immunologists** working in Austria, having a **maximum of 15 years of scientific experience after completing their PhD.**

9. About the EFIS EJI Ita Askonas prize

The prize was established in 2009 by EFIS and the European Journal of Immunology (EJI) to acknowledge female group leaders in immunology who have run an independent laboratory for a minimum of four and no more than ten years.
About the prize

Until 2021, the prize was awarded every three years. Beginning in 2023, the prize has been awarded annually and is coordinated by the EFIS Task Force on Gender and Diversity, which reviews nomination packages and decides on the awardee. The prize consists of a €20,000 cash award, plus support for travel, accommodations and registration to attend an award ceremony to be held at the next European Congress of Immunology, ECI 2027 in Florence, Italy.
